

## TRAINING ON STRANGULATION PREVENTION IN INTIMATE PARTNER VIOLENCE



Strangulation is one of the most lethal forms of violence used by men against their female intimate partners, unconsciousness may occur within 10 seconds and death within 4-5 minutes.

Strangulation is an ultimate form of power and control where the perpetrator can demonstrate control over the victims's next breath.

Victims who are strangled may have no visible injuries, yet because of underlying brain damage due to the lack of oxygen during the strangulation assault, they may have long term serious injuries or die days, even weeks later.

The lack of external injuries and the lack of identifying near-fatal strangulation cases among professionals led to the minimization of this type of violence, exposing victims of violence to potential serious health consequences, further violence and even death. domestic unit or between former or current spouses or partners, whether or not the perpetrator shares or has shared the same residence with the victim.

- Enhanced knowledge and understanding of professionals
- Improved policy and practice among the legal, medical, and advocacy communities
- Increased offender accountability
- Enhanced victim safety

#### What does the training offer you?

- Identify the symptoms and consequences of non-fatal strangulation
- Understand and recognize the anatomy and medical aspects of surviving and non-surviving victims
- Investigate and document cases for prosecution
- Respond adequately, life-saving and, with the necessary skills to situations of attempted strangulation
- Enhance victim safety through trauma-informed support services

#### Why should professionals learn more about strangulation?

- Early intervention, prior to a homicide saves money and lives.
- The impact of children witnessing strangulation violence cannot be underestimated. Children witness approximately 50% of all strangulation incidents causing deep, long-term emotional trauma.
- Strangulation can be categorized as attempted homicide or murder. Appropriate legal follow-up is important to protect victims and hold perpetrators accountable.
